Workshop: Mr. Kovats explained Ordinance 2017-18. Mr. Burke pointed out that canopies would only be permitted for food establishments. Mr. Cohen asked if there are regulations regarding flaps/drop downs on the canopies.

Mr. Kovats explained the resolution for the Mixson property is not something the Board typically does but it was a request from the prospective buyer of the property.

ORDINANCE 2017-18, AWNINGS & CANOPIES

Mr. Kovats stated the ordinance is created to streamline the permitting process and allow for canopies to be permitted in approved outdoor dining areas. Mr. Cohen would like the Mayor and Council to consider whether they want to permit flaps/drop downs on the canopies. He was concerned that his would create an enclosure. Mr. Magovern was further concerned that people would then try to use heat in these enclosed canopies. Mr. Magovern was concerned about the structures not being removed in the winter. Ms. Claudio pointed out that there is language regarding use in the winter in the ordinance. Mr. Kovats found it in the ordinance and read it to the Board.

Mr. Windas made a motion to authorize Mr. Kovats to send the Board's comments to the Mayor and Council, which was seconded by Mr. Meyer and approved unanimously.

Public: Gene Creamer, 4th Avenue, was concerned about the language of the first page of the ordinance. He felt the Borough cannot legally amend the State Uniform Construction Code. Mr. Kovats stated the Board did not draft the ordinance but could share Mr. Creamer's comments in the letter he will draft to the Mayor and Council.

Mr. Meyer made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which was seconded by Mr. Reynolds and approved unanimously.
