MOMENT OF SILENCE: Our troops and their families, Dorothy Walsifer and Chuck Provenzano

WORKSHOP DISCUSSION:

Mayor Walsifer stated we are working to keep the town safe. An Executive Order will be issued that allows the Borough to prohibit parking on the street to residents only. Mr. Kirschenbaum stated we are trying to discourage people from other towns coming to our town during the pandemic. Mayor Walsifer stated we do not want to hurt the businesses so we will not stop people from other towns coming to businesses.

Mayor Walsifer stated last summer we received a letter that we had to pay back \$1 million to FEMA. We have worked with them and were able to get the amount reduced. Mr. Kirschenbaum stated it will be around \$500,000 now.

Councilman Carvelli asked about the signs on 7th and 8th near the railroad tracks. Mr. Kirschenbaum stated NJ Transit will be doing work there to the crosswalks and will be done on or around May 22nd.

Mayor Walsifer stated DOBCO is still working on finalizing the contracts with the other property owners but it has been delayed due to COVID-19.

Councilman Carvelli asked about the summer rentals. Mayor Walsifer stated inspections will not be done until May 6th with people moving in Memorial Day weekend. We are continuing to get the beach ready as if we will have a normal summer. We are monitoring what other towns are doing but we have to follow the Governor's orders. Councilman Brennan stated agreed we have to follow the state to make sure everyone is safe. Councilwoman Wann suggested reaching out to the realtors to let them know our plans.

Councilman McCracken asked for an explanation on the restructure of our finance office. Mayor Walsifer stated the resolution tonight is to make Christine Manolio an Assistant Finance Officer. She will work with our new CFO and auditor. So far it is working well.

PETITIONS: None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Councilman Carvelli made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 7, 2020 meeting, which was seconded by Councilman Brennan and approved unanimously.

REPORTS OF COUNCIL:

Councilman Carvelli: Encouraged everyone to do the best they can. To stay healthy and active and to support our businesses.

Councilman McCracken: Things are going well at the Housing Authority. The Friendly Sons of Shillelagh and Spring Lake Manor donated food to the residents. Shade Tree Commission is reviewing ordinances from other towns. Hopes the Governor will allow statewide testing so we can reopen safely.

Councilwoman Wann: Community Policing is still in place and emails went out to Block Captains. Thanked the Borough staff for working 24/7. Hopes everyone can support the businesses.

Councilman Brennan: Everyone is doing a good job. Offered condolences to Mayor Walsifer for the passing of his mother. Arts Council is closed but posting virtual tours and classes online. Thanked the Mayor for stepping up on the parking issue. We always welcome visitors but have too many coming in right now. He asked how we will enforce the parking. Mayor Walsifer stated there will be signs and we will depend on the residents for assistance. He added we will most likely start with shutting down the south end of town.

Mayor Walsifer: Borough Staff is working at 110%. Restaurants are doing a great job to get people fed. Belmar Elementary is doing a great job feeding the children.

<u>PUBLIC SESSION:</u> Public Session on resolutions only on the Agenda. We will continue to have a Public Session at the end of this meeting.

Gene Creamer, 4th Avenue, asked about the functionality of the ATMs. Mayor Walsifer stated they will be placed at the ticket booths on the boardwalk and are a convenience to visitors. We had them last summer as well. Mr. Dasti explained the company is paying the Borough \$10,000. Mr. Creamer asked if we had approval from DEP. Mr. Dasti stated it is not required because they are not permanent structures.

Chris Picconi, 17th Avenue, thanked everyone for doing a great job and applauded the Mayor for deciding to restrict parking.

Mayor Walsifer made a motion to close the public session, which was seconded by Councilman Brennan and approved unanimously.
